

## Welcome to Year 4

We hope you have had a lovely summer and we are looking forward to lots of exciting times ahead with your children!

















- Reading books (and Bug Club) children should spend 15-20 minutes reading each day and comments are to be added to your child's reading record by you.
- English homework will be linked to work in school and given out on Seesaw.
- Maths homework (on Mathletics) linked to work in school
- Spellings again these will be published on Seesaw.
- Project boards linked to their topic will be advertised on our newsletter and should be completed by the end of the term.

Homework will be published on Friday and is expected to be completed by the following Wednesday.





▶ Each class will have an enrichment for the curriculum every half term or termly. This may be a trip, a visitor or a workshop depending on what the children are studying. This term we have organised a workshop on Vikings on 8<sup>th</sup> November linked to our topic on Invasion! and children will be asked to come in dressed up as an Anglo-Saxon or Viking for the day.

## Although there is some anxiety about the amount of learning that may have been lost during previous lockdowns, please be assured that we will be working hard to make sure that your child is able to catch up on their learning throughout the year no matter what their starting

Practice papers in tests will take place throughout the year to reinforce test conditions, celebrate learning and to ensure your child is confident and resilient. No child should be worried about tests or fear them but see them as an opportunity to show what they can do. Anything that they cannot do, will be recovered and retaught if needed.



This is a statutory requirement set by the government and has been reintroduced for June 2022 following the cancellation last academic year. In order for your child to do well in this assessment, it is vital that they have a rapid and accurate recall of all times tables facts up to 12 x 12. We will be teaching children times tables throughout Year 4 but practise at home (little and often) also plays a vital role in helping children to remember and recall the number facts.
