Dear Parents and Carers,

Another full week with lots of hard work and special events for some classes. Here are the highlights:

- It was lovely to see so many of you visiting us for 'Stay and Learn' this week. It seems like such a long time since we hosted 'Stay and Learn' so it was great to get back to get back to normality.
- "INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY"
- 8th March was International Women's Day so every class studied the impact that many great women have had in society and thought about the impact that they themselves could have as they, too, see the strength they have within their beings. EYFS studied our recently departed Queen and learnt all about her dedication to her role. They learnt much about the queen including the fact that she often wore purple because that was a colour that denoted royalty. Well, it just so happened that I was wearing purple that day so when I walked in, Maia (R1) was rather overwhelmed and shouted out, "It's the Queen!" I wouldn't have minded but nobody curtseyed!! Just plain rude!! Seriously, though, the children were really well-versed in all matters relating to the Queen. Year 5 wrote newspaper articles about their most inspirational women and also researched a variety of historically successful women such as Emmeline Pankhurst while 2A watched some videos about a few lesser-known female pioneers/inventors and considered their impact on the world. Year 1 discovered all about how Coco Chanel beat the odds of her upbringing and became a famous fashion designer designing the much admired 'Little Black Dress' and Amelie (1B) thoroughly enjoyed telling me that Coco didn't just 'do' fashion, she 'was' fashion!! Year 4 combined their study of climate change with discovering the great work that Greta Thunburg to move politicians to take action. Indeed, as I was meeting a new family about to join our school and I was explaining how the behaviour in the school was of an excellent standard and that we won't accept anything but the highest standards of behaviour, there came the most riotous noise outside the office door shouting and chanting about Climate Change, stamping feet and thumping banners! I had to very quickly explain to the new family that the noise was a re-enactment of a protest march but I'm not sure that they were wholly convinced since it was so 'real'!

- Year 6 were treated to a live Zoom talk from a successful business woman currently living in Australia. She informed them about the history of International Women's Day and the inequality that still exists all over the world. We certainly ensured that every Harrow Lodge Student understood the importance of gender equality and not settling for stereotypical roles if that's not what you truly desire in life. It was an amazing day full of female empowerment and some fantastic work was covered. Let's hope all our girls got the message loud and clear!
- Staying on the theme of International Women's Day, Baris (4B) came in laden with flowers for all the girls in his class and for myself and Ms Clarke. Thank you so much, Baris, for such a thoughtful gesture. It really made everyone's day!
- Y5 were treated to a theatre experience about pollution and the consequences of allowing pollutants to continue to invade our environment. The theatre company showed very clearly how the pollutants from car exhausts damage children far more than adults (or small people more than tall people!) because they're lower to the ground and more in line with the polluting gasses. Dolcie (5B) pointed out, very astutely, that she was surprised at that information because she'd always learnt that you need to 'get down low' if you find yourself in a smoky room because the fumes rise up. We were all very impressed with Dolcie's contribution!
- On Wednesday, we had another visit from HHS students who delivered a lesson to 5B about mental health. Mr Norris (Assistant Head Teacher at HHS) was really impressed with our Year 5 children, their engagement and behaviour, but most of all, he was impressed with their use of high-level vocabulary! As this is a major part of our school improvement targets, we're really pleased with that!
- This week, the nurses came into school to measure and weigh our Reception children to ensure that they're all growing at a safe and healthy rate. One of our little ones asked the nurse if she should remove her cardigan and shoes - now there's a child who's witnessed mum's weekly routine on the weighing scales!!! I even remove my rings before getting on those scales!!
- Year 4 were lucky enough to have a visit from Yasmin this week. Some of you may remember that Yasmin works for HMRC and she came in to teach our Year 5 and 6 children about taxation and a career working for HMRC. Well, Yasmin will be visiting us on a weekly basis for the next 9 weeks as part of HMRC's outreach program. This week, she was working with groups of children on catch-up interventions, Doodle maths and TT Rockstars all very important interventions especially with Year 4 about to take the Times Table Check in June.
- I had a meeting with the Local Authority this week with regard to Attendance matters. Our real difficulty is the number of children we have in our school whose attendance lies below 90%. So I will be inviting parents in, from next week, to discuss these attendance issues and any support that may be needed so we can nip any problems in the bud!

- 5A visited a working farm today. They left amid snow, sleet and gale-force winds and boarded the coach with less than eager faces. As they drove, the weather worsened, the children sat silent, each one contemplating the dire fate that awaited them when, out of the silence, rang Freddie's loud voice as he sang, "We're on the highway to hell....."!!! In the end, the children had a super time as well as learning a great deal about sowing and growing! Thank you to all our parent helpers, without whom most of our trips wouldn't be able to take place.
- The Essex County Fire and Rescue Service got in touch with me this week to invite parents to bring their children to the Essex Fire Museum (situated behind Grays Fire Station) for their Open Day on the 1st, 11th and 30th of April to celebrate their 75th anniversary. There will be opportunities for families to get involved in history trails, craft activities and a chance to sit on the fire engines (and squirt water ②). The museum is free entry (but visits are by appointment only.......as they are on the site of an operational fire station). It's time for our annual Easter Bonnet Competition and Easter Parade!


Prizes for the most creative bonnet in each class.


