Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to a special Coronation Edition of the newsletter. Here are this week's highlights:

We started the short week with a Bank Holiday followed by another strike day! 4 classes were open on Tuesday but even those were short on numbers which is a great shame when you think that they practically had the run of the school to themselves!

The school was like a Ghost Town but the teachers loved the peace and quiet and got through twice as much work as normal with the children who did come in.

- There's been a palpable *frisson* of excitement in the air this week as classes have prepared for today's celebrations. I've heard the Coronation Song beating out its rhythm right across the school and our singing practice on Wednesday just confirmed what I already knew - that we are an amazing singing school and none of us have a problem singing *King* instead of *Queen* during the National Anthem!!!
