Dear Parents and Carers,

Another busy week! Here are the highlights:

 We started the week by receiving the responses to the SEND Unit Consultation that we sent out on the 10th January and the Local Authority were thrilled because it was the biggest response they'd ever had to a SEND Unit Consultation. There were 142 responses, 129 of which were in favour and 13 that



- had concerns. The concerns were all very valid, mostly concerning increase in noise and traffic and whether the places available would be given to children within the borough or outside the borough. We knew we could answer those concerns and hoped to do so at the face to face follow-up meeting. 4 consultants came from the Local Authority for that 6:00 pm meeting and, by 6:15 pm, it was clear that no one was turning up! So, we all had a cup of tea and a biscuit and went home!! We assumed that everyone was happy with the proposal or they would have turned up to raise their concerns in person so we were very satisfied at the turn-out!!!! On the note of responses, I'd really like to thank you for your support the Local Authority said that we must have a really vibrant and supportive community to which I agreed whole-heartedly!
- We love to encourage great citizenship and, this week, we had several children wishing to raise money for good causes. Dexter (1B) and Alice (2B) are siblings who reached out to me with a request to sell second-hand books to raise money for GOSH (Great Ormond Street Hospital). They had done their research and decided that this was a charity close to their hearts and one they'd like to support. They approached Miss B asking for some staff support (and Miss B volunteered her dad!) and then they set about collecting merchandise. They also made bookmarks to accompany the books and sold those as well. They pitched their business idea to the whole school on Monday and set up their fund-raising business on Wednesday after school. They made a fantastic £63.50 at the book sale after taking out the float! They had a wonderful time and learnt a great deal about fund-raising in the process! I'm so proud of them and look forward to seeing how much they raise in total.
- Still on the fund-raising theme but at the other end of the school, Olivia (6A) is taking
 part in The Big Winter Wander 2025. She is raising money for WWF (World Wildlife Fund),
 a global conservation organization that works to protect the environment and
