Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the 7th issue of our newsletter and the real start to the autumn weather. Here are the week's highlights:

- This week children have been celebrating Black History month with a range of activities including learning
 - about famous black movers and shakers that changed the way the world thought to African drumming, dance and costume. You know when a theme has been successful when you have a stream of children lining up outside your door keen to share with you everything they've learned and all the work they've produced from their lessons!

So, watch this space for the first child to attain the much-coveted 'Black-Belt' it could be your child!!

Using their imaginations and being proactive, they decided to use the crates from Opal to collect the rubbish around the field. It wasn't something they'd been asked to do but it was lovely to see them taking care of the school environment. We have no prefects yet so Mr Finch was very grateful for the extra help!!
- OPAL itself continues to be added to. This week, musical instruments appeared which were a most welcome addition to the fun and frivolities of lunchtime play.
